You know marijuana is legal in New York, but...

There's information to be aware of with NY's new cannabis laws. For instance, did you know:



The effect of edibles can be delayed by four or more hours. Today's marijuana is a lot stronger than it used to be and can effect people differently. If you're going to consume marijuana, start low and go slow.



Marijuana is not legal for everyone.

If you're under the age of 21, it's illegal for you to use or possess marijuana, and marijuana can harm your developing brain. It's illegal to give or share marijuana with anyone under 21 years.



Driving while impaired is illegal,

putting you and others at risk,
no matter what substance
you're using. In NY, it's called
DWAI-Drugs or Driving While
Ability Impaired by Drugs. If you're
not sure if you're high or impaired,
stay put, and don't take
the chance.



Marijuana is not safe for pregnant and breastfeeding persons and should not be used, just like alcohol or tobacco should be avoided. Marijuana can harm your baby's developing brain.



Marijuana can be addictive.
